The buzzing, punky acoustic doesn't really ask much of the listener at all, and all of the backing instruments do nothing but accentuate Virago's gritty vocals. Ultimately, this album is a musical form of both escapism, and confrontation. The stories of each track may share a theme of being on the run, or reaching for some sort of Heaven, but in this musical expression, there is a defiance of the social retardation that exists in many places in the world.
